- 2. Not only has God provided the means for salvation, but He desires all men to be saved and come to the knowledge of the truth (1 Timothy 2:4). God's terms for salvation are by faith in the person and accomplishments of His only begotten Son, Jesus Christ. In fact, there is no possibility of salvation in any other, for there is no other name under heaven given among men by which we must be saved (Acts 4:12). The same holds true for Jew and Gentile alike. When the Jews came to Jesus asking, What shall we do, that we may work the works of God? Jesus definitively answered, This is the work of God, that you believe in Him whom He sent (John 6:28–29). In Romans 10, Paul highlighted the absolute need of faith in Christ for both the Jews and Gentiles. He first pointed out the folly of Israel's rejection of faith. From there, he expounded on the glorious results of faith, sounded the rallying call to faith, and warned of the ramifications of resisting faith. Use the divisions below to note and comment on the essentiality of faith:
